DAY FOR LIFE Every year the Church in England, Wales, Scotland, and Ireland marks the Day for Life, as a reminder of the need to respect and protect the inherent value and dignity of each life. This year it will be celebrated this weekend on 15th June, Trinity Sunday. Our second collection therefore will be for this appeal, however, donations can be also made online via the Catholic Bishops’ Conference website, where you will find out more information about Day for Life.

SECOND DONA CONTACTLESS MACHINE Some of you may have noticed that we now have second card machine in the JPII Centre. This works in exactly the same way as the one in church. The contactless card system works very well from an administrative point of view and we are pleased to say that increasingly more parishioners are using this method to donate. We would encourage all parishioners and visitors to use these machines to make donations and other payments to the church. DONA machine payments can be made for your weekly 1st collection offerings, 2nd collections, piety goods, candles and sanctuary lamps, mass offerings, 100 Club, tea & coffee, baptisms, weddings, car park and for general donations to the church. **GIFT AID** If you pay tax then you will be able to Gift Aid your donations for the parish to claim 25% on your donations without it costing you anything. Currently only a quarter of donations are Gift Aided, the parish would gain much more if more tax paying parishioners simply signed and dated a form. Please consider doing so. Speak to Fr Craig or contact Sr Sani if you required more details, forms are available at the back of church. If paying on the machine, please follow instructions on Gift Aiding when prompted, details only require to be entered the once per *each card* used.

CORPUS CHRISTI PROCESSION This will take place on Sunday, 22nd June after the 11am Mass. The procession route will unfortunately have to be re planned as the Garth Park will be used for another event on that day. More details as soon as they have been finalised. First Holy Communion children are invited to join the procession wearing their 1st Holy Communion outfits. If you can help marshal the route please mention to Fr Craig or email the office.

EXTRAORDINARY MINISTERS All Extraordinary Ministers are invited to be recommissioned next Sunday, 22nd June at the 11am mass. Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion play an important role in parish life, by helping the parish community through distributing the Eucharist. While this may often be during the Mass, the role may also include taking Holy Communion to people in the wider parish community who are house-bound due to health, age or disability. Before the beginning of the earth, Wisdom was brought forth.
